

Paolo L. Bürgi is a free-lance landscape architect based in Camorino, Switzerland . He is adjunct professor of Landscape Architecture at the University of Pennsylvania, professor at the Istituto Universitario di Architettura di Venezia and at the Politecnico di Milano. He has participated in many international competitions winning several prizes, such as the Open-air museum in Gorizia's Karst, Italy; the 'CERN-Route de Meyrin' in Switzerland or the 'Helsinki Toolonlathi Parks' in Finland. Bürgi has presented papers at conferences in Canada, USA, Argentina, Chile, Korea, China and throughout Europe, and his work has been published in a wide range of specialist literature. In 2009 a monographic book has been published for Princeton Architectural Press: "Paolo Bürgi. Landscape Architect. Discovering the (Swiss) Horizon: Mountain, Lake and Forest" and in 2011 followed for Casa Editrice Libria, Melfi: "Paolo Bürgi. Paesaggi-Passaggi".

In 2003 Bürgi received the 'European Landscape Award Rosa Barba' in Barcellona for the Cardada project, and the 'Die Besten 03-bronze Award' for the project 'Kreuzlingen Hafentplatz', Switzerland.
