+ As a fluid place?

Intense urbanization challenges the boundaries of peripheral landscapes.

The multiple different edges of Greater London, each that marks contrasting limits of London's planning, transportation, port, and Green Belt jurisdictions, creates interstitial zones of uncertainty and opportunity.

In Tilbury, located on the edge of London where the tidal River Thames intersects the Green Belt, the M25 motorway, the Greater London Authority (GLA) boundary, and the limits of Transport for London, there are unique landscape fragments that can be understood as new forms beyond the city or rural.
